It is with great pride and satisfaction that the Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary (CCGA) presents you with its Annual Report of Activities for the year 2009.

This past year has kept our Auxiliarists very busy with a total of 1,749 taskings to 1,549 Search and Rescue incidents. The CCGA maintained the emphasis on training its members who took part in a total of 2,224 training exercises.

With 4,007 members and 1,166 vessels valued at \$310 million, the resources made available to the Canadian Coast Guard are considerable and the contribution of our volunteers significant (about 281,188 volunteer hours in 2009).

The CCGA is continuing the implementation of the SAR Management System. We are also looking forward by considering two significant initiatives: the first Global Risk Analysis of CCGA operations in 20 years, and a National Visioning and Values exercise.

On behalf of our 4,007 members, I'd like to thank the Canadian Coast Guard for its continued support.

Highlights and Recognitions

March 2009

An important project developed by the Coast Guard Auxiliary in Quebec is approved by the New SAR Initiatives (NIF) Program and will obtain \$420,500 in funding from the National Search and Rescue Secretariat. The project, which will extend over a three-year period, aims at developing partnership agreements with the municipalities and improve the SAR capability of auxiliary units in Quebec.

CCGA-Pacific Unit 35 (Victoria) participates in a rescue exercise. The scenario is based on a collision between two vessels. The exercise is also documented by a video produced by the CCGA National office which was later awarded an Hermes Platinum Award in 2010.

April 2009

The CCGA launches its Pleasure Craft Safety Check Program (PCSC). The program will initially be offered in the Pacific and Quebec regions.

May 2009

The "Missing Fisherman" video produced by the CCGA with the help of TOWARF in Oakville is presented with an Award of Distinction at the 15th Annual Communicator Award Competition.

June 2009

The "2008 Public Service Announcements" produced by the Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary to celebrate the 30th Anniversary of the CCGA are presented with an Award of Excellence at the 2009 Videographer Award Competition.

July 2009

A new Log Book to record SAR Incidents and Radio Communications is distributed to all CCGA units.

August 2009

A major training exercise takes place in Sept-Iles, Quebec. CCGA-Q Unit 25 is tasked to two separate scenarios over two days. The two simulations are covered by regional and national media and are later used to produce training videos.

November 2009

Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary members Bobby Noble and Tejay England from Lewisporte, Newfoundland

are presented with Certificates of Commendation for Exceptional Bravery at Sea by Mr. Efthimios Mitropoulos, Secretary-General of the International Maritime Organisation (IMO).

December 2009

A new SAR Management System User Manual and Training Video are been produced by the CCGA National Office. The User Manual and Training Video can be used to learn the basic functions of the SAR Management System.

Three CCGA productions are rewarded at the 2009 International Marcom Award Competition and the 2009 International AVA Award Competition. The CCGA *SAR Management System (SMS) Training Video* is presented with a Marcom Platinum Award plus an AVA Platinum Award in the Training Video category. The *Bobbie Noble Video* is presented with a Davey Silver Award and a Marcom Gold Award in the Inspirational Video category. Finally, the CCGA French video *Kayakistes en difficulté* wins an AVA Gold Award for Film – Foreign Language.

January 2010

The Marine Professional of the Year CASBA Award is presented to Jack Kruger for his outstanding contribution as member of the CCGA C&A.

February 2010

A new Corporate Leaflet is published by the CCGA National Office. The leaflet is available for Boat Shows or other public events to promote the good work of the Auxiliary.

The Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary (Quebec) Inc. wins an Award of Distinction in the Business and Organization category at the 14th edition of *Mérite québécois de la sécurité civile*.


March 2010






CCGA Vessels 2009






CCGA Pacific currently has 1,039 members and 72 enrolled vessels valued at \$8.5 million. In 2009, Auxiliarists were tasked 848 times.



CCGA Central & Arctic currently has 741 members and 100 enrolled vessels valued at \$10 million. In 2009, Auxiliarists were tasked 270 times to SAR incidents.












